

## Fourth Sunday After the Epiphany January 27 & 28, 2024



On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now." This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

Lutheran Braille Workers -Mission Grant of \$100,000 The Light of Christ for the Blind and Visually Impaired

Millions of people throughout the world are blind or visually impaired and are seeking to strengthen their faith while coping with isolation and dealing with physical, mental, and spiritual struggles. They have the desire to read the words of our Lord themselves, so that they can feel and learn about the love of God and the salvation of Jesus for them.

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) freely supply materials in specialized large print and braille to people who are visually impaired. This grant will help LBW format, produce, and distribute an additional fifty to one hundred new Scripture-based materials to meet spiritual and emotional needs of recipients with vision impairments around the world.

This project is being funded through coins and dollars received through LWML's mite boxes. If you'd like to support this project, pick up a mite box from the LWML table in the south entryway. Drop in some coins, then return it to the collection plates at any St. Matthew service. Or you may designate a Mite Box donation with your regular envelope offering.
